"Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ¹⁴ As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, 15 but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, ¹⁶ since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ¹⁷ And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, 18 knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. 20 He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you ²¹ who through him are believers in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.²² Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart, 23 since you have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God; ²⁴ for "All flesh is like grass" and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, 25 but the word of the Lord remains forever."

So put away all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander. ² Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation— 3 if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good."

Why is confessing our sins an essential first step to be used by God?

Isaiah needed to be purified (made holy) before his commissioning. What impact does our holiness have on the calling God has placed on us?

Do you think it's possible to be holy in some areas of your life while not in others?

Is there any step you want to take in light of this passage?

FOR PRACTICE

This week's memory verse is 1 Peter 2:2, which says, "Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation." The spiritual milk Peter's referring to is the enduring word of God and the same thing he mentions in 1 Peter 1:23 as the source of their new birth. If you're not setting aside regular time to fill yourself with God's Word, then you're undernourished! Set a goal, start a habit. Whatever it takes. Get into the Word. Start this week, and keep it up.
