²⁸ “But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. ‘Pay back what you owe me!’ he demanded.

²⁹ “His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, ‘Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.’

³⁰ “But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. ³¹ When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.

³² “Then the master called the servant in. ‘You wicked servant,’ he said, ‘I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. ³³ Shouldn’t you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?’ ³⁴ In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

DIGGING DEEPER

1. In the message this weekend Pastor Andrew mentioned that forgiveness is generously forgiving a genuine debt against us and refusing our right to payback. In 1 Samuel 24:1-13, we see an example of David refusing his right to revenge on Saul even though he had been wronged. How and why do you think David was able to deny his desire for payback?

What is the most challenging aspect for you in extending forgiveness and forgoing your right to payback?

How can this passage (along with Romans 12:14-21) help motivate us to forgive instead of seeking payback?

2. One of the hardest parts of forgiving is getting past the hurt we feel for what has taken place especially when the other person doesn't apologize or try to make the situation right. Read Ecclesiastes 7:20, Romans 3:23 and 1 John 4:19-21. How might these verses help someone who is holding onto bitterness or the feeling that certain people don't deserve to be forgiven?

What would you say to another Christian who told you that it's impossible for them to forgive someone that's hurt them?

In 1 John we're told in order to love God we must love our brother and sister. How do we forgive someone, or even love them after they have hurt us?

3. Read Ephesians 4:29-32. What do you think it means to forgive others just as in Christ God forgave us?

How is God's forgiveness of us different than the way that we forgive others?

How does extending forgiveness make us more like Christ?

What is the connection between the things Paul mentions in verses 29 and 31 with the forgiveness he describes in verse 32?
