QUICK REVIEW

Thinking back to the sermon this weekend “Everything in Light of the End Vision,” in a sentence or two summarize the main point.

Looking back at your notes, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged or confused you?

GETTING STARTED

1. In the sermon this weekend, we focused on God's “End Vision.” When you think of “The End” what thoughts or images come to mind and from where did they come?

2. How do you think your life would change by focusing more on living in light of God's end vision as we find it in scripture?

DIGGING DEEPER

3. Read Genesis 12:1-5. What does this passage tell us about God's purpose for Abram?

How does Abram's life fit into God's End Vision that we looked at this weekend?

How would you have felt if you were in Abram's shoes?

Do you think responding to God's call on your life requires a response as dramatic as Abram's? Why or why not?

Do you think this passage tells us anything about the purpose of our calling?

4. Read Luke 10:1-12. What stands out to you in this passage

If the workers are few as Jesus said, why do you think he sent the disciples out in pairs?

Christians today make up roughly 1/3 of the Earth's population (2.4 billion in 2012). Do you think the workers are still few? Why or why not?

What do you think it means to be sent out like a lamb amongst wolves?

How do you think this passage could apply to us today or is this just a passage for “missionaries”?

5. Read John 17:13-18 and 20:19-23. Why do you think Jesus repeated his message about sending the disciples?

Do you think this message was only for the disciples or all followers of Jesus?

What do you think it means to be sent as Jesus was sent? (Hint: what specifics about Jesus' sending also apply to us?)

To whom do you think Jesus may be sending you?

What does Jesus equip us with before sending us?

7. How can the group be praying for you to better respond to God's call on your life?
