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Discussion Questions - Week # 1

QUICK REVIEW

Thinking back to the sermon this weekend "When God Seems Late," in a sentence or two summarize the main point.

Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged or confused you?

GETTING STARTED

1. What is the longest thing you've waited in line for intentionally or unintentionally? How long did you wait?

2. How do you think our culture and technology contributes to our ability or inability to wait for God?

DIGGING DEEPER

3. Read Luke 2:25-38. In what way do the two characters Simeon and Anna exemplify the discipline of waiting?

What factors do you think led to their perseverance in waiting?

Do you think Simeon or Anna were surprised by the discovery of what they were waiting for?

What do you think they would have missed out on if they hadn't continued to wait on God?

4. Read 1 Samuel 16:1;10-13 & 2 Samuel 5:1-5. The time between King David's anointing and appointing was roughly 15 years. Why do you suppose God waited so long to make David King?

Do you think it would have made a difference for David if God anointed him king the year before he was appointed, instead of 15 years?

Read 1 Samuel 24:1-10. While David knew God had called him to be King, why do you think he chose not to slay Saul, while he was answering nature's call?

How do you tell when God wants you to wait on Him, and when God is presenting you with the opportunity for which you've been waiting?

5. Read Psalm 27:1-14. In this Psalm, David encourages us to be confident and strong. Yet, often, the longer we wait for God, the less confident we feel. What are things we can do to maintain our confidence that God will act, even when his intervention is long delayed?

What were the things David experiencing that may have caused him to lose confidence that God would intervene?

Twice in verse 14, David encourages us to wait for the Lord. What does it mean to you to wait for the Lord? Share an instance in your life when you have had to wait for the Lord?

7. What's something that you're currently waiting for God to do for you? How can the group be praying for you?

8. What steps can you take this week to be proactive, while you wait on God's provision?
