We Live In "Interesting Times"

There is an old saying, "May you live in interesting times." This idiom dates back to the first half of the 1900s. Many claim it is of Chinese origin, and that it is an ancient curse, but there is no known equivalent expression in Chinese.

One of the most famous uses of this phrase was by Robert Kennedy in a speech in the year 1966. He said, "There is a Chinese curse which says, 'May he live in interesting times.' Like it or not we live in interesting times. They are times of danger and uncertainty; but they are also more open to the creative energy of men than any other time in history."

RFK meant that the 1960s were interesting because of all the fear that people had over what the future would hold.

I wonder if you can see any parallels to the times in which we are living right now.

We would be tempted to say that these are 'unprecedented times,' were it not for the fact that as you study church history you discover that these times were not that different from the time at which the church was born.

The Apostles used the technology of their day - letters delivered along the network of Roman cities and shipping routes - to empower and equip area church leaders who were located outside of their immediate reach. Social distance and "shelter in place" orders did not stop them from continuing their ministry.

A quarter of the book of Acts, which is the authoritative story of how the church began, is a playbook on how to do ministry in forced confinement. The last chapters of that book record the period of time during which Paul was in Roman custody (Acts 21-28). Being confined did not limit his reach.

Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians are the letters of Paul which we often refer to as "the prison epistles" because Paul wrote them while under house arrest. They were living documents, written to provide real-time ministry encouragement to the three churches he planted.

During Paul's forced confinement he maintained his sense of ministry urgency and so are we. The COVID-19 pandemic has caused us to fast-track our plans for expanded online ministry and to look for new and creative ways to maintain contact with all of those in our church family.

I'm so grateful to all our staff and congregation who have adjusted so well to the rapid changes that all of us have had to make. None of us would have chosen these circumstances, as those in which

we would be doing ministry, any more than the Apostle Paul would have chosen to conduct his ministry from inside a Roman prison cell. Nevertheless, I think that we can say along with Paul:

"And I want you to know, my dear brothers and sisters, that everything that has happened to me here has helped to spread the Good News." Philippians 1:12

I'm looking forward to the time when we can be back together again to worship on the corner of Colorado & Loleta, but in the meantime I'm looking forward to seeing what God is going to do through the ways in which we are doing ministry right now.

I want to thank all of you, our church family, for your support and encouragement as together we see to lift up Jesus Christ as the only source of true hope in this broken, chaotic world.

Last year was one of the most important, exciting and happiest years in my life. The last 15 months I worked at church as the Interim Director of Children's Ministry; and less than two months ago I became a full-time staff member. I strongly believe God's timing is perfect and working in children's ministry all this time has been very rewarding and uplifting, an experience I wouldn't trade for anything. I know God is moving in our church and in children's ministry in big ways and I'm glad to be a part of this movement.

Let me share with all of you some of the great things God has done so far in our ministry. Last year on Easter we were able to share the gospel in new ways to all the kids, staff and volunteers. We also offered five KI/PO for our church families and the community around. Events like Kids In/Parents Out have helped us to be known in the community as a generous church with open arms to help the families.

On Christmas we hosted our 6th event called Jingle Jam and this time families had the opportunity to stay. The event was a success! We had about 140 to 150 people, about 50 more people than expected. We had 6 completely new families that came from all different venues to the event, some of these new families made ERBC their church as a result of the caring and shepherding we offered to them in the weeks ahead. To God be the glory! We gave away 15 Bibles to both new and regularly attending children that came to Jingle Jam, plus more Bibles have been distributed in months after that.

In recent weeks Children's Ministry has been able to host two more events in different ways, our Easter and Mother's Day Drive Thru events. For Easter we distributed 70 Easter baskets to church families. We had 4 new families that heard about the gathering and came to get their own Easter baskets. And for Mother's Day we prepared 80 pastry boxes, 60 of the boxes were given to mothers and grandmothers the day of the event and 20 more boxes were distributed to moms in the community. I'm glad to report that events like the Easter and Mother's Day Drive Thru are helping our church members to stay in touch with each other and not to lose sight of the main goal which is "More People, More like Jesus"

As you can see God is good and His love for the Next Generation has been shown to all of us through generosity and growth. Talking about generosity our ministry also helps families in need, sometimes it's sending a meal, giving a gift card for a grocery store and so much more when families need it.

I would like to add that our virtual services have been very uplifting for the parents and their children in these uncertain and difficult times. The connections we are making right now through shepherding and being intentional are very valuable to our kids and their families. I can't wait to see what God has in store for our Children's Ministry in the months ahead. May God continue giving us the wisdom to lead the church and His people.

Looking back on this year, I am praising God for the ways He has used us to advance His Kingdom in Los Angeles and various parts of the world. God's name will be glorified, and I am humbled to be a part of His work. I have seen more and more people stepping up to serve and living lives of worship. I see people being inspired by the weekend worship services and living lives that honor God throughout the week, living side by side with the lost, and offering the hope that can only be found through faith in Jesus.

Spreading the love of Jesus to our community is the number one reason we do JAMPAC each year. This year, 100 students K-8th grade were a part of the *Jesus And Me Performing Arts Camp*, a week-long day camp put together by our staff and volunteers. JAMPAC has served as an onramp for people in our community to get involved at ERBC for over a decade. The kids learned and performed the musical "Danny & The Shacks" in one week's time. Parents, friends and family filled our Worship Center to hear about the saving grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. JAMPAC serves us internally to raise up future worship leaders from Elementary and High School. JAMPAC also serves as both outreach and evangelism that happens due in large part to the generosity of our ERBC family.

Leading the congregation in music worship throughout the year is a special passion of mine. Our choir has been growing steadily in size and expertise. Besides our Christmas Choir services and Easter Choir we held four special worship services to encourage our congregation to live out their worship throughout the week. Volunteers came out and "Decked the Halls" on the inside and outside of our church campus. We created a photo opportunity wall inside the foyer and a coco bar inside the coffeehouse, to make ERBC a fun place to invite your family and friends during the holidays.

I held Worship Arts Auditions every 4 months, calling on the congregation to rise up and "Be The Church." Each time our congregants stepped up to join the choir, play, sing and serve in tech. Even though people constantly come and go, God always fills the void. People's talent can vary greatly, but each of us can begin the process of serving by being open to God using us, many times, in spite of our weaknesses.

In addition to my primary role of planning and leading weekend worship services, I also took on new roles and assisted our staff by providing technical support and facilitating groups. In addition to leading a life group each semester, I led the summer Hiking Group, gave my support to the Men's Camping Trip and provided audio/video support and for the Women's Retreat and Women's Tea. I also worked closely with Pastor Andrew to incorporate new vision and strategy into the Welcome Team Ministry.

This year, I did a major install of energy efficient LED stage light fixtures in the Worship Center with our Sound Coach, Matt Westman. We have planned and saved for this project for many years, and we finished on-time and under-budget. LED light fixtures give us greater flexibility to match the look of each sermon series with the press of a button, save energy and help to create a

worshipful ambiance in our sanctuary. With your help, we will continue to make improvements that reflect the glory of God and serve to spread the good news.

A central focus of ours this year has been to **Love God** and **Love People**. Invite tools, Servant Evangelism, Special Events, Day Camps and Special Worship Services have all been designed to share the love of Jesus Christ with our community. Thanks so much for continuing to partner with us in this mission to be living reflections of God's glory and living expressions of his love for all people.
